# Health and Safety

• Brett Avery is looking at a possible upgrade to the slipway winch drive system to improve its safety. He will also check the winch's securing bolts as they are subject to saltwater immersion during spring high tides.

# Financial Report

- The April financial accounts were presented by Trish.
- Month-end result was a loss of \$7.6K against a budgeted loss of \$0.5k.
- Bar recorded a loss of 4.3k. Bar purchases \$2.3k above budget and Bar labour 2.9k above budget.
- \$2k has been transferred from the building fund to assist with monthly payments
- A year end Bar stock take was completed by Trish and Oli.
- May results will be impacted by the one-week Kitchen and Bar closure.
- A building valuation is required for the insurance renewal. Trish will attempt to locate the last valuation report.

- The club's accountant has the necessary documents they require for the completion of the Year End accounts. We expect to receive the YE financial statement before the end of May.
- Ongoing: Club house hireage continues to provide a financial benefit to the club.
   Stephen to look at putting a flyer together to help with promoting the club house as a venue
- Ongoing: Joel has ordered a meter so that we can check long term power usage of the club's refrigeration units.
- Bank Account balances are available to Club Members on request.

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# **Correspondence Report**

#### Inwards:

- Insurance renewal documents received from Aon One key point this year is the building will require a valuation.
- Email received from Jay requesting that an opinion piece he wrote outlining his opposition to the Waipiro Bay marina proposal be published in the May Mainsheet newsletter. Three committee members considered his request and decided that the Mainsheet newsletter should not be used to promote political, policy or other public issue viewpoints that the club itself has not taken a position on, on behalf of its members. Mark instead published an informational item.
- The club's Commodore has been invited and so will attend the YNZ AGM
- Ongoing Kitchen extraction duct inspection and cleaning Ian has checked our latest insurance policy endorsements and can confirm that there no requirement to have them professional cleaned. They do require regular inspections (not less than annually), and cleaning as required. Any work that the club does here must be documented.

# **Sub Committee Reports**

#### Social & Events - Helen Thomassen

- Mike, via email and Fletcher, at the meeting thanked Helen for the outstanding job she
  is doing with arranging and running social events
- Ongoing: Helen investigating band options for next year's Tall Ships.

#### Building & Maintenance – Bruce Mitchinson

- We are still having issues with the Beer Taps Stephen to approach Phat House to arrange an audit of our equipment and collect their recommendations for improving the set-up.
- Shower waste is blocking. Mark to try some Drano
- Fletcher suggested that we install a swing door in the 2<sup>nd</sup> opening so that we can leave the outside door open during winter opening hours. New door will require a small window so people can see if there is someone on the other side.
- Stephen has offered the club some firewood.
- Working bee. Look for a date with a low tide. The first Sunday after the AGM could be a possibility. Key jobs include repairing jetty piles and handrails.
- Ongoing New Dock the club has been offered a second-hand dock that is significantly larger than the current dock. It's also in very good condition. The club will require a variation to its existing Resource consent which means we will need to store the dock for several months while this process is underway. Andrew Riddell has offered to assist with the resource consent.
  - Update the dock is still available; it is currently being stored on dry land in the Te Puna Inlet. Bruce has sourced some piles, and Andrew has offered to drive them for free.

• Ongoing: The planned upgrade to the bathrooms is progressing. Fiona and Helen submitted a grant application to cover the costs of this upgrade. See Fundraising section below for more details.

# Kitchen, Bar & Cleaning – Fletcher Sunde & Stephen Pepperell

- A 12-month employment agreement is expected to be signed with the club's new chef this week.
- The Chef position will report to the Club Caption, Fletcher
- A sample menu has been presented which appears to be acceptable. Stephen will assist with developing the new menu, pricing and printing later this week.
- A good KPI for the kitchen operation is "Food Cost Percentages"
- Mark requested a minor change to the Chef's Role Profile Ian
- The chef will be required to order stock.
- Kitchen will require a printer for meal orders
- The club will require a kitchen hand for 2 hours per night. The kitchen hand will report to the chef.
- Budget to be re-worked lan.
- Kitchen will require a deep clean by the lessee before he leaves.

# Sailing - Mike Bennett and Stephen Pepperell.

- Prize giving date still to be confirmed.
- A skippers pre-season meeting will be arranged prior to the start of next season's racing
- The club is encouraging the Wind Warriors (RC yachts) to use the club's jetty and other facilities on Wednesday nights during the winter period from 4:30pm onwards. Mark suggested that they run a demonstration day to show club members their sport.
- Ongoing Rules night for skippers, will be a Thursday night date still to be set
- Ongoing Stephen has agreed to assist further with communications with the club's racing sponsors.

# Tall Ships

- Next meeting to be arranged after the kitchen new chef role is established.
- Ongoing Still looking for someone to coordinate proceedings for the week leading up to the event and on the day.
- Ongoing Bruce and Fletcher working on content for a Tall Ships article & program publication.
- Ongoing Bruce is working on the event poster.
- Looking at also running other events on the Russell wharf during the Friday.
- Ongoing: Ian will email all contestants of this year's regatta thanking them for supporting the club by participating in the regatta and inviting them to attend next years 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary event.

# Slipway, Dinghy Dock & Moorings

- Jetty security is an ongoing issue. One option the committee will investigate is improved lighting in the form of a solar powered sensor activated LED flood light mounted on the outer pontoon. Fletcher to investigate options.
- Ongoing Barry has limited capacity to continue with the Slipway operation. Update – The club has received an email from someone willing to take this role on. Bruce will arrange an interview with this person together with Barry.
- Ongoing: The club will provide a rubbish bin in the winch shed for slipway users to
  deposit any material collected from the hull of their boats while using the slipway. The
  boat owner will still need to remove and dispose of this material when their boat is relaunched.

# **Fundraising**

- Ongoing Helen and Fiona have submitted a grant application with the Lottery Grants Board to cover a long list of much-needed building upgrades. The value of the grant application which is mainly focused on the bathrooms upgrade is valued at \$100k. The club won't hear the outcome of this application until June 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Ongoing The Nauti Penguin has agreed to run one of their community fundraisers for the club's youth sailing.

• Ongoing: Trish presented pricing for printed the RBC logo stickers. Their size approximately that of a cell phone. Cost pricing - \$3.28 plus GST each for an order of 100.
