


THE FIRST 20 YEARS.

In a recent research into the foundation and first twenty years history of the Russell Boating Club, interesting aspects of earlier Matauwhi Bay have emerged.

It is noted that the first Club for boating enthusiasts was established as the Russell Sailing Club in 1936 and it continued until 1938. Unfortunately there is no documented evidence to indicate its' full activities, and it seemed to fade from the scene.

However, there was still activity in the Bay with L & G Warne Bros. Boat building business. Their boat building shed was erected on the site of the present boat club and at least four well known boats were launched from there. In 1934 the "KNOXIE II", which was sold to Fullers and renamed 'HISS RUSSELL'. Then in 1939 came the 'KNOXIE III'. This was also sold to Fullers and renamed "MISS IDA". Then came the 'PIRATE' which was built for Mr Otto Sommers. It was surveyed and skippered by Mr Jim Whitelaw and was used extensively for game fishing. After the 'PIRATE' the "MARLIN" was built for one of the Warne Brothers - it likewise was surveyed and is now used for game fishing out of Tauranga.

In the period 1946 to 1952 the Russell Yacht Club was in being, and was a very active club throughout these years. They chose as their future sailing fleet an American Cat boat design, 15 foot in length and had 7 boats built. The cost of these at the time was 31 pounds per hull. The Club conducted sailing races, log trials for power boats and staged fun races and picnics.

Among their ambitious projects was the staging of 2 One Act Plays - ("The Willing Horse" and "Birds of a Feather"). To do this they had to write to London to obtain production rights and were advised that a royalty of 10/6 (ten shillings 6 sixpence) would have to be paid per performance. Gowns, wigs etc had to be obtained from Auckland and the Plays were finally staged in the Russell Town Hall on November 20th 1947. One hundred and eighty nine tickets were sold resulting in a nett profit of ten Pounds.

In 1952 the momentum went out of the Club and it finally went into recess leaving their small clubrooms still on the foreshore of the inner Bay.

Following the closure of Warnes' boat yard in early 1940, their old shed was abandoned until it was later taken over by a Mr Bill Hopkins and used as a Fish Receiving Depot. This only operated for 12 months or so then closed. The shed remained empty once again for a period until Mr Mick Clifford took it over also as a fish depot. This too failed to last and the building was once again abandoned. Hikurangi Fisheries who were trying to get established in the Bay of Islands, took the building over and established their Fish Factory there - this lasted until approx 1971-72 when they closed in Matauwhi Bay and moved to Opua.

A little before this time, Mr Joe Bosanquet and his wife established themselves here and commenced a business known as Marina Services, principally to cater for all visiting and local yachties. He established several moorings in the Bay, did a lot of Jetty reconstruction with floating pontoon, built a side walk access around the old shed, also put in place a shower, toilets and wash room at the rear of their premises in what is now the Garden centre in the old Port and Starboard building. He had a bore sunk to obtain water which he piped out to the jetty. This bore incidentally is still supplying water to the club. After selling his business he took a very active part in the development of the club, and did so right up to his death. He was one of the Founding Members and was appointed Club Captain at the inaugural meeting.

In the absence of any organised boating activity over a period of years, it was felt by many that another club should be established. This was reported in the 'Advocate' on the 3rd August 1971, that a meeting of interested parties was held in the Russell Town Hall on that date, to establish a club to fulfil the development of water sport in the area, and improve boating facilities, and so at this Inaugural Meeting, the *RUSSELL BOATING CLUB' was officially founded with Dr Ramsey elected Commodore.

The next couple of years was given to a period of consolidation. Drawing up club rules, establishing a constitution, organising sailing events and activities, and entering into practical negotiations with the Harbour Board for the establishment of shore facilities and the taking over of the old fish factory for proposed club rooms.

A visual scene of the area in those days show an old rusty tin shed abandoned by Hikurangi Fisheries, a jetty in need of repair and the beach cluttered with old mooring poles, slips and cradles.

The club finally received approval to lease the old shed and immediately set about clearing it out ready for upgrading. Early members recall that this was one of the dirtiest and messiest jobs they had been involved in - removing old tarred cork from the chill room, removing old pieces of machinery and rubbish accumulated over the years, replacing rusty iron and repairing gaping holes in the floor.

From this humble beginning has evolved a progressive club with a membership of 286 (at time of writing) fine spacious clubrooms and deck space. A large modern kitchen, bar and chill room together with all comfort amenities. It is ideally situated with adjacent beach and park-land with service facilities for all craft, and now must rank as one of the foremost boating and recreational clubs in the Bay of Islands.

The feature event each season is the staging of the Tall Ships Regatta, which this year (1990) provided one of the most spectacular sights ever to be seen in the Bay.

Thirty two large yachts and seven square rigged ships competed in the event, with hundreds of smaller spectator boats all in the Bay. The sight of 7 square-rigged ships racing almost abreast under full canvas made a stirring and Impressive panorama of sail.
